## How to light propane lamps

## **TO LIGHT PROPANE LAMPS**

- 1. Make sure all appliances are turned off.
- 2. Carefully check lantern globe. It should be a little loose in fixture to allow for expansion when hot. If globes are tightly screwed in, they will shatter. Lamps can be lit without a globe if necessary.
- 3. Check the mantle, as a hole in the mantle could cause the globe to break. Extra mantles are kept in a plastic drawers near the cookstove. When changing the mantle, do not touch the silk part. The oil in your skin will cause a hole in the mantle when lit.
- 4. Before propane is turned on, light the new mantle and allow it to burn out before relighting it for use.
- 5. Light match and hold near but not against mantle. Mantles are very fragile—do not let the match (or anything else) touch the mantle.
- 6. Turn on gas.
- 7. If a globe should fall off when the lamp is lit, turn off the lamp. Do NOT touch the globe until it has cooled; globe will be very hot.

## TO LIGHT PROPANE BURNER

- 2. Have a match or long-handled lighter ready, and slowly push down and turn one of the brass levers into the on position. The middle lever works best.
- 3. Ignite the propane at the burner.
- 4. Turn the remaining brass levers into the on position.

TIP: If the cabin has been closed for a time, the lanterns can be tough to light: the air in the propane line can blow out your match. Start the burner first to heat water, then try to light the lanterns again.
